2021 Fire Season

For the 9th year in a row, the Reedsport Volunteer Fire Department will not issue burn barrel or debris burning permits within the Reedsport City limits for the 2021 Fire Season. There will be no exception to this policy for the duration of fire season.

The Fire Department stopped issuing permits on Friday, June 4th, 2021. This occurred at the same time Coos Forest Protective Association announced that fire season had started.

The reasons for this policy are:

- To protect the welfare of the community
- Reduce the cost of fire operations
- Alignment with neighboring fire agencies
- ♦ To provide for firefighter safety

Warming fires, otherwise know as campfires or recreational fires (for cooking and other non-debris burning activities in approved containers), are still allowed year round (Except during Extreme Fire Danger) and do not require a permit. We ask that you burn safely and responsibly. Use clean, dry firewood, do not leave the fire unattended. Please, put fire out when completely finished and be aware of smoke intrusion in your neighborhood, which is regulated by City Ordinance 6.08020 (1)

The Lower Umpqua Senior Center has operated out of its current location at 460 Winchester Ave. since 1989; that same year the center was incorporated as (LUCC, Inc.) a 501(c)(3) Nonprofit operating under a volunteer board of directors. The

board currently has six members and is always looking for additional volunteers.

The Center's commercial kitchen is used to prepare and serve homebound seniors



and disabled citizen's meals three-days a week. Meals are served on Tuesdays, Thursdays' and Fridays. Although the Center is currently closed, they are providing curbside pickup and delivery for those in need. If you are interested in volunteering or in need of the program please contact Karen Robertson (Douglas County Senior Services) at 541-271-6211 for information and assistance.

The program continues to seek volunteer drivers whom are willing to give a minimum of 2 hours per week to deliver and prepare meals for citizens. If you are willing to give any amount of time to the program please reach out to Karen. Volunteers will need to complete a County volunteer application and submit to a background check.

The Center is not currently accepting equipment donations such as wheelchairs, walkers or other items due to the pandemic. If you would like to help seniors in our area, please consider a monetary donation to help offset the fundraising deficit caused by the mandatory closure of the Center. All donations are tax deductible and go to help individuals right here in our community.

The meals-on-wheels program and the Center is a multi-agency collaboration between the City of Reedsport, Douglas County Housing Authority, Douglas County Senior Services, Bateman Community Services and LUCC, Inc.

save & conserve

With a water Eco-Kit

The City of Reedsport has partnered with Central Lincoln People's Utility District (CLPUD) to offer our customers energy efficient water saving kits, FREE of charge. Proper installation of the items in these kits should result in annual savings on customers' water* and electric bills.

Water Saving Kit Contains:

- 1.5 gpm Showerhead. Replace existing bathroom showerhead with water saving showerhead. Recognized in Good Housekeeping and Newsweek.
- 1.5 gpm Swivel Kitchen Aerator. Replace Existing kitchen aerator with this water saving model.
- Toilet Tank Bank. Fill the bag to line with water and insert into toilet tank to save water with each flush.
- Flow Meter Bag. Use this bag to measure the water your showerhead/aerator uses.
- Leak Detection Tablets. Drop these tablets in the toilet tank. If water in the toilet turns blue, you have a leak.
- 1.0 gpm Faucet Aerator. Remove existing bathroom aerator by unscrewing it. Replace with this aerator for savings.
- Fill Cycle Diverter. To use, attach it to the fill hose and it can safe as much as 0.5 gallons per flush.
- Pipe Sealing Tape. Use this tape to form a tight seal when installing your showerhead to avoid costly leaks.




◆ Toilet Flapper. Replace existing leaky flapper to prevent tank water from leaking into the toilet.

If you are interested in a kit, please download an application at www.cityofreedsport.org or pick up a form at City Hall. This form MUST be filled out, signed, and returned in person to City Hall in order to receive your FREE WATER SAVING ECO-KIT. Persons who wish to receive a kit must have active accounts with both the City of Reedsport and CLPUD. Supplies are limited, so hurry in and get yours to-day.

Limit: one kit per customer and/or household.

*Only metered water customers may see a savings. Flat rate customers will conserve water by installing these kits, but will not see a reduction in their water bills. *Provided in partnership with CLPUD.



All children under the age of 16 must wear an approved helmet when riding a regular bicycle, skateboard, skate scooter or roller/in-line skates. These may ride on the sidewalk, bike lane/path, or in a crosswalk.



The minimum age to use an Electric Assisted Bike, Electric or Gas Scooter is 16 years of age and they must wear an approved helmet. While they cannot be used on sidewalks, they can be used on bike path/lanes.
