# **New Pump Station for Forest Hills**

In 2021, the City of Reedsport applied for a Community Development Block Grant from Business Oregon for the design, engineering, and environmental review to relocate an existing sewer force main (line) and replace the aging sewer pump station serving the Forrest Hills area. Unfortunately, that application was denied, however staff was encouraged to reapply in 2022 for the construction phase of the project.

Our persistence paid off as we were officially awarded \$2.3 million from Business Oregon for the engineering and construction costs associated with the project. The project was originally identified as a need in the 2004 Waste Water Facilities Plan completed by Brown & Caldwell Engineering and has been

deferred for many years due to lack of funding. The project was originally identified as a rehabilitation project, Unfortunately with the passage of time the City is now looking at a total replacement rather than a rehabilitation project. The grant funds will cover 100% of the project costs with \$25,000 or less of City funds needed.

In the coming months staff will begin the formal process to award a contract to an engineering and



construction firm. The construction aspect of the project is anticipated to begin sometime in spring 2023.

#### Vocal Smoke Alarm

Have you ever wondered if your children or elderly parents might sleep through a smoke alarm instead of getting to safety did you know there is a vocal smoke alarm that allows you to personalize a message during a threat to better help those in your home to get to safety?

The KidSmart Vocal Smoke Alarm among other brands lets you record a message specific to your child. Since the Vocal Smoke Alarm includes an alarm tone, a vocal message and a bright light ring that illuminates during drills and in case of an alarm, your child is three times more likely to respond.

Recording your message is easy. In addition to repeating your child's name, you can issue instructions about leaving the home in the event of a fire, reminding your child not to open a hot door or to cover their face if smoke is present. There's a fire drill button so that you and your family can practice exiting the home as you would in the event of a fire.

When purchasing a smoke alarm, a battery -operated photoelectric smoke detector, which excels in detecting slow, smoldering fires. These fires produce substantial amounts of smoke before bursting into flame.

Brandon joined the department alongside another officer, Jacob Molano, whom you can learn more about in the January news-letter.




