

Free Water Meter?

In August of this year the City of Reedsport began offering a temporary Water Meter Program for residential owners to aid in the purchase of new waters meters for those wishing to transition away from a flat rate. The program covers the purchase of the meter and standard hardware (a \$422 value), the property owner is only responsible for the cost of the installation which is currently set at \$125. On the slight chance that the meter installation is not considered standard our Water Department will provide a free-of-charge estimate based on time and material prior to commencing. The meters are available on a first-come, first-serve basis and require the installation fee to be paid in full at the time of reservation. The program is for

existing customers of single-family residences which includes duplexes. The program does not apply to new construction or



commercial buildings. The program is currently limited at one meter per customer.

Participation is voluntary.

Fireplace & Woodstove Safety

From the Reedsport Volunteer Fire Department

- Burn dry seasoned wood. It creates less creosote build-up in the chimney.
- Have your wood stove or fireplace flue cleaned and inspected annually by a qualified professional.
- Use only newspaper and kindling or fire starters to start a fire.
- Always use a fireplace screen. It keeps hot embers and logs from escaping and igniting the surrounding area.
- Dispose of ashes in a tightly covered metal container, outside and away from combustibles.
- Keep the doors of your wood stove closed unless loading or stoking the fire.

On average, each year in Oregon there are 590 home heating-related fires that cause over \$8 million in damage and kill or injure 16 people.
