

## **PARKS AND BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE**

The Parks and Beautification Committee was established in 2009 by combining two previously existing boards, the Beautification Committee and the Parks Committee, to create a more efficient committee. Applicants are appointed by the Reedsport City Council for three year terms from within the City of Reedsport. The duties include advising the City Council on issues concerning citywide beautification and City park properties, recommending amendments to the City Park Master Plan and the City Beautification Master Plan. This committee meets at least three times annually. Three representatives also serve on the City's Tree Board.

## **CITY TREE BOARD**

The City Tree Board was established in 1993 by chapter 6.24 of the Reedsport Municipal Code. Applicants are appointed by the Reedsport City Council for three-year terms from within the City of Reedsport. The duties include advising the City Council on issues concerning trees and shrubs in parks, along streets and in other public areas. This board meets as needed. Three members are from Parks and Beautification Committee, one member from City Council and one member from Planning Commission.

## **BUDGET COMMITTEE**

The Budget Committee is established by ORS 294.336. Applicants are appointed by the City Council for three year terms. Applicants must be eligible voters who reside within the City of Reedsport. The duty of the Budget Committee is to receive the proposed budget from the Budgeting Officer, review the proposed budget, make revisions as desired, and approve the budget for presentation to the City Council. The Budget Committee members serve with the City Council on the Budget Committee. The City Council has the responsibility of approving the City Budget each fiscal year and establishing a final tax levy amount and a tax levy rate for the City. This committee meets approximately five times per year, three meetings of which are during the month of April.

## **DANGEROUS BUILDINGS ABATEMENT BOARD OF APPEALS**

This board was established in 1999 as a requirement of state statutes. Applicants are appointed by the Mayor to three year terms and ideally consist of members representing the building construction industry, specifically framing, plumbing, electrical, foundations, with the building official serving as an ex officio, nonvoting member. The duties are to enforce, on behalf of City Council, the preservation of public peace, health and safety. Meetings are held as needed.

## **PLANNING COMMISSION**

The Planning Commission was established in 1998 as a requirement of State Statutes. At least five members of the Planning Commission must be City of Reedsport residents. Two members may be non-City of Reedsport residents, but either reside within the Urban Growth Boundary or have ownership of property within the City limits. Applicants are appointed by the City Council to four year terms. The planning Commission functions primarily as a comprehensive planning body by proposing policy and legislation to the City Council and implementing regulations relating to growth and development of the community. Meetings are held on the fourth Monday of each month at 7:00pm and additionally as needed.

## **TRAFFIC SAFETY ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

The Traffic Safety Advisory Committee was established in 2001. Applicants are appointed by the City Council from within the Reedsport City limits for an undetermined length of time. The duties of the committee are to advise the City Council on traffic safety issues. Meetings are scheduled on Thursdays at 1:30 p.m. every three months.

## **UMPQUA EXPERIENCE STEERING COMMITTEE**

The Umpqua Experience Steering Committee was established in 1994. Applicants are appointed by the City Council for three year terms. Six members must be residents within the Reedsport School District #105 boundaries, with at least three living inside Reedsport City limits. The duties of the committee are to advise City Council on issues concerning development and operational policies of the Umpqua Experience, assist the Director with implementing policy adopted by the City Council, and to assist in an annual membership drive.

## **URBAN RENEWAL DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARD**

The Urban Renewal District Advisory Board was established in 2007 as required by state statutes during formation of an urban renewal district. Applicants are appointed by the Urban Renewal District Agency from within the Lower Umpqua Hospital District to four year terms. The duties of the board are to act in an advisory capacity to the Reedsport Urban Renewal District Agency, to act as advocates for promoting and developing the URD and to assist in the preparation of the annual budget. This board meets approximately five times a year at a time determined by the Committee.
